**LT**

Kédé! Pabaisa! 2021, aliejus, drobė, 240 x 171 cm

Gulint ant grindų, kambarys atrodo visai kitaip. Knygų lentyna tampa pastatu, stalas – tiltu, kédé – pabaisa.

Iki šio paveiksllo (Kédé! Pabaisa! 2021, aliejus, drobė, 240 x 171 cm) visas mano ankstesnis kalbėjimas ir rašymas apie kūrinius atrodo sausas ir pernelyg teorinės prigimties. Rašiau taip: „Be sentimentalijų ir intymių būsenų bei istorijų, aplinkos daiktai talpina daug kitų žmogaus būties ženklų. Mūsų aplinka pilna objekty, kurie prisisunkę istorijų, svajonių, netekčių, džiugesio ir liūdesio. Mano kūrybos pagrindinis motyvas yra paprastas kasdienis daiktas. Daiktų įdomumas atsiskleidžia ne tik per jų daugiaprasmį kontūrą ar ženkla, bet ir per egzistencijos užtaisą. Daikto motyvas mane patraukia, nes reiškia bent dalį manęs.“

Šis metaforinis daiktų manifestas skatina atkreipti dėmesį į mūsų kasdienę paprastą, kartais net nuobodžią, aplinką. Ją stebint atsiskleidžia įdomūs ir netikėti ženklai. Mes išdalinei save į jvairius spalvotus daiktus, randamus kambaryje, palėpėje ar garaže.“

Nieko neišsižadu, tiesiog šiuo atveju negaliu kalbėti taip pat.

Šį kartą paveiksle vaizduojamas motyvas – medinė kédė, man sukėlė išgąstį. Ta mūsų kasdienė aplinka, kiek pasikeitus mano žvilgsnio režimui į ją (atsigulus ant grindų), tapo bauginanti – pabaisiška. Šis minėto metaforinio daiktų manifesto skyrius ne tik apie žmones ir jų projekcijas į daiktus. Skyrius apie momentą, kada atrodo, kad aplinkos objektai nuo tavęs nepriklauso ir akimirką tampa visiškai svetimi, nepažįstami ir savarankiški.

Paveikslas Kédé! Pabaisa! yra trumpas siaubo eilėraštis apie kédę-pabaisą ir žmogų.

## **EN**

The Chair! The Monster! 2021, oil on canvas, 240 x 171 cm

While lying on the floor the whole room looks completely different. The bookshelf becomes a building, the table – a bridge, the chair – the monster.

Before this painting (The Chair! The Monster! 2021, oil on canvas, 240 x 171 cm) all my previous speaking and writing about works seems dull and overly theoretical based. I wrote: "In addition to sentimental and intimate states and stories, everyday objects contain many other signs of life. Our surroundings are full of things that are full of stories, dreams, losses, joy and sorrow. The main motif of my work is a casual object. The significance of things is revealed not only through their ambiguous contour or sign, but also through the sense of human existence. A part of me can be found in the object and that is why the motif attracts me."

This metaphorical manifesto of things encourages attention to our everyday simple, sometimes even boring, environment. Interesting and unexpected marks can only be revealed by observing it. We have divided ourselves into various colourful items which can be found in a room, an attic or a garage."

I do not deny anything. In this case I just cannot make the same statement.

This time the painting's motif – the wooden chair – literally frightened me. After I changed my regular point of view (I was lying on the floor) our everyday environment became scary and monstrous. This chapter of the previously mentioned metaphorical manifesto of things is not just about humans and their projections into objects. The chapter is about the moment when the

objects of the environment seem to be on their own and for a minute become completely strange, unfamiliar and independent.

The painting The Chair! The Monster! is a short horror poem about a chair-monster and a human.
